Meet the Deo's:

• Jaz's current involvement with the club is to make sure the bar does not end up with out-of-date beer. He will also apply to be the club's beer taster if ever there is such a position. - Ayrton represented the NT in the Under 14 rep side in 2011.
- Sachin also loves the game of Rugby. He was recently appointed the 2012 SUPER UNDER 10's CROCS captain.

How did you become involved in Palmerston?
