From there we moved to Brisbane where every year I look forward to the rugby season so I can watch the Reds and Wallabies play but mainly for the Palmy reunions and the opportunity to wear the frock of shame.

First rugby memories? Watching the 5 Nations on the ABC in the late 70's and early 80's this fuelled my interest in rugby.

Favourite Palmerston memories? I looked forward to going to training and playing rugby and partying afterwards with my mates, it was like one big family where everyone looked out for each other. Becoming President of the club after I had retired and the club winning the premiership in A grade & B grade and also grand finalist in C grade along with a number of the junior teams winning or playing in grand finals.

Other Clubs? Where do I start?? Some say I played at more clubs than Slim Dusty but I have my doubts!!!! South Darwin twice, dare I say it Casuarina, Maroochydore, Gold Coast Eagles, University of Qld. Managed to travel overseas and played in USA, Wales and England.

How did you become involved with Palmerston? I shared a room with Snogga and Doggie on a NT trip to Adelaide and they made it quite clear in those few days that I should play with Palmy or suffer the consequences. Seriously it was that trip where I managed to make some very good lifelong friends and it so happens that most of them were the Palmy players so when the next season started I was in the Palmy jersey.

What do you miss about Palmerston? Certainly not playing rugby in the Darwin heat but just the friends and Palmy family which had become a big part of my life. My time at Palmy was what a rugby club should be like and a lot of clubs could have learnt from it.

In the spotlight this week is an article that appeared in the Daily Telegraph recently...

Wallabies coach Robbie Deans tried to get Chiefs halfback Tawera Kerr-Barlow to change allegiance

The Wallabies chased him, Western Force wanted him, but Super Rugby's hottest halfback Tawera Kerr-Barlow has had only one dream since the age of three - an All Blacks jersey.

Even his mother Gail Barlow, who represented the Australian women's rugby team in the mid-90s, could not sway him to represent the country of his birth. "Robbie Deans came to speak at a function in Darwin, where they presented me with my Wallaroos cap retrospectively," Gail said.

"He spoke to me and certainly was very interested in what Tawera was planning for his future. I explained to him, 'Good luck with that'.

"Tawera declared from the age of three he wanted to play for the All Blacks, despite his mother playing for Australia."

He re-signed with the Chiefs and looms as a candidate for New Zealand.

As any proud parent would, Gail is backing her son to achieve his dream, to the point where she was helping him train over the Christmas holidays when he returned to Darwin.

"She was up at 6am with the stop-watch. There was no lazing around in the holidays," <u>Kerr-</u> <u>Barlow</u> said.

Gail said: "That time of year is the hottest and most humid in Darwin. You get close to 100 per cent humidity.

"He really felt the heat. He was doing shuttles, sprints and a long run each week.

"To the horror of everyone else, we went out on Christmas day and trained. He didn't take one day off."

It is this dedication to fitness that has helped Kerr-Barlow develop into the form No.9 of the competition.

"I trained really hard in the pre-season, because it was important for me to be able to play the style of game I play for 80 minutes," Kerr-Barlow said. "I would do it for 40 or 50 minutes, but I couldn't sustain it for 80.

"Now I can play that physical, high-pace game for the full 80. I did a lot of roadwork during the holidays."

Kerr-Barlow was born in Melbourne but at six months moved to Darwin, where he lived until age 13. It is a city he still considers home and at the end of the interview he requested a "shout out" to his friends and family in the Territory.

At 13, Kerr-Barlow declared his desire to play rugby in New Zealand and started at his father Rei's old school, Hamilton Boys High, and graduated to the Waikato squad.

When John Mitchell was in charge of the Force, he tried to lure Kerr-Barlow to Perth.

And <u>Wallabies</u> high-performance manager David Nucifora also contacted Tawera and Gail to have him change allegiance. But the 21-year-old stuck solid.

"It is my ultimate goal and dream, but I don't go out each week thinking I will make the All Blacks with a good performance. If it happens sooner than later it would be good," Kerr-Barlow said.

This week he confronts an unchanged <u>New South Wales Waratahs</u> side in Hamilton, with Brendan McKibbin holding his place as NSW's halfback.

THE CLUB HOUSE

When reflecting on the building of the Clubhouse I am reminded that many things came together to build our great facility without the usual associated debt that burdens many organisations.

Firstly it was a dream of many early committees to build a clubhouse and they frugally managed to put away a little each year so that by the mid 80s we had about \$20 000 in the bank – a tidy sum in those days but still not enough for much more than a simple change from which would have been stage 1 of many stages. To this day I am not sure who to give credit for this financial discipline to, as it never appeared elsewhere in any of our lives that was obvious to me.

Secondly, by moving to Palmerston and being one of the first sporting clubs to do so, we had (after much lobbying) been able to negotiate a block of land on the condition that we build the clubhouse.

Thirdly we had a bit of luck when, as Chief Engineer for Public Works at the time, I noticed that Moulden Primary had been funded to put a toilet block beside the oval - from memory about \$80 000. I immediately advised Barry Coulter (our local member and Minister) that it would be embarrassing for all concerned if two toilet blocks were built beside each other. He agreed and after some discussion it was negotiated that the money should come to us and we would build a clubhouse and allow access to the change rooms by Moulden Primary – and everyone was happy. Barry remained Patron of the club for many years and turned the first sod in 1991 (see photo).

The building process was actually a pretty happy one with the builder doing a fine job and agreeing to no contract variations (as we had no more money anyway).

In my view the clubhouse has been a great asset and become a second home to many of us – especially since the clock stopped and we have (not so good) excuse for being home late. Anyway it still works for me!!
