- Watching the club win its first ever premiership.

The friendships I have been fortunate to have from rugby make me proud to be a part of the Palmerston Club.

A PREMIERSHIP WIN (continued...)

Last week we remembered the club's first ever A Grade **Premiership.** Here's how Craig Leach, who was responsible for the 'late kick that sealed victory', recalls the game:

A Grade Vice Captain Craig Leach: The 1990-91 season was a breakthrough year for the Crocs A grade. We had experienced premierships in B and C grade before, but never at top level. The team believed it itself - we were fit, young [mostly] and hard. I remember the competition being close, games were hard and rucking was alive and well. Palmy always had tough forwards, but now we had backs too. We were the young guns, Greencans had us drilled and we were hungry to take the Premiership.

The final against RSL Dragons was as close as you could get, 3 all at the 79 minute mark, and when we knocked that last penalty over, the crowd on the Palmy hill erupted. I thought we had a few minutes to go and Boulder was jumping all over me, so I cursed him and told him to be ready for the quick kick off. It was full time. We couldn't believe that we finally had done it. I remember the older Crocs being so proud, as they had slogged it out for so long and finally we had the shield. Captain Snogga was on the news saying to his boss that you won`t see him at work for 3 days!!!

I learned a lot about rugby that year, mostly about commitment to your team mates and belief in yourself. If you have those two, you are nearly there. I wore that premiership jersey everywhere and it has pole position in my cupboard - I just can't fit into it anymore. Great days, great mates and great memories.
