

## Where are they now?

Lives: Melbourne, with wife Nicky and children Josh and Caitlyn

Hailing from the clan Bree, the Palmy Crocs were always going to be in my blood, but what may surprise you is that coming from such pedigree of Bernie Bree and having uncles Dennis, Paddy and Noel, I did not start my playing career until I was 18! Dennis was holding out until he could play a game alongside me before he retired, that has been and gone and I think he is now waiting for Hamish, Tommy and Josh (the next generation) to come up and play!

I have a fond memory of playing a game early in my career, on my 18th birthday, where the name Bree featured heavily on the players' sheet. Bernie, Dennis, Noel, Paddy, Daniel and myself ran on (some got pretty puffed just doing that), my grandfather Gerry called the coin toss and a then young James was ball boy. Those were early days when I started on the wing in C grade! I quickly learnt that A) the ball does not get out there very often in C grade, B) a Bree is not actually fast enough to be a winger and C) I don't care about my hair style enough to be a back, so the progression to side of the scrum was made to mix it up with the big boys. I have also had the pleasure of playing in the tropical midday sun with Burls, Squirter, Boulder, Fang, Backpacker, T-Bear, Brock Spider, Mud Crab, Smoking Joe, Snogga to nick-name a few.

Palmy has always been a club with an amazing culture, and a strange aversion to clothing, that is very hard to replicate anywhere else. This is the current passion until I can pull on the purple shorts of golden oldies and run around again. Until that point I remain a strong Reds supporter (with a touch of home ground Rebels) and have so far resisted the peer pressure of trying my hand at AFL.



# HALL OF FAME

Commencing at our 35th Anniversary Dinner, Palmerston Rugby Union Club will induct former players from all eras of the club into the Dalmerston Rugby Union Club Hall of Fame. In the first year the club will induct up to 10 members and then each year up to two more will be added. Inductees are drawn from all teams starting with the first side in 1976.

While consideration is given to a players' on-field career, induction is not based on statistical achievement alone. To be eligible for inclusion in the Palmerston Rugby Union Hall of Fame, a player must have:

1976-1979

- Played at least one representative level game
- Played over 20 A Grade games for Palmerston

1980 onwards

- Played at least one representative level game
- Played over 50 A Grade games for Palmerston
- Been retired from Palmerston Rugby for at least two years

All eras

- Made a major contribution to the game of rugby in the Territory
- Demonstrated outstanding ability, sportsmanship, commitment, character and personal contribution to their team and the game of rugby in their era.

# HALL OF FAME

A four person committee has been established to elect the inductees into our Hall of Fame. The committee members have extensive experience in playing, coaching, refereeing, administrating and/or supporting rugby. We are proud to introduce the committee to you.

#### **Bernie Bree**

Palmerston's "Mr I've Done Everything" man. Bernie is one of the original Crocs who established the club back in the '70s and has remained a club stalwart ever since. He has played and coached all senior grades including A grade, served on the committee and been the club president for 6 seasons. Bernie is also a Life Member of the club and was voted the *Club Person of the First 25 years* at our 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2002.

#### **Wendy Leach**

Wendy joined the club in 1986 when her two sons, Cameron and Craig, came to play for the Crocs. Wendy has probably watched more Palmerston Rugby Union games than any other person as she has hardly missed a game since she joined the club (until recently this meant driving up from Batchelor every weekend). Wendy is also a Life Member of the club and with her husband Mal they sponsor the Leach Award for the season's most promising junior.

#### **David Lev**

David Ley joined Palmerston Rugby Union Club in the 1992-93 season. His involvement with Palmerston has seen him play A Grade, coach A Grade, serve on the committee and be Club President. He is currently a club sponsor. Dave is a Level 3 coach who has previously coached the NT at both senior Mosquitos and Schoolboy level. He has also coached the Australian Combined States Schoolboy side as well as refereed NTRU games at an A Grade Level.

#### **Garry Russell**

Garry joined Palmerston in 1979/80 and played A grade for the club during the 80's. Garry could be considered the club's best ever administrator, having held every position on the committee over numerous years including 6 years as President. It was during one of these stints that we won our first A Grade premiership in 1990/91. Garry is a Life Member of Palmerston. He has also managed several NT representative sides at both schoolboy and senior Mosquito level.

But the intention will remain the same, that is to let you know what the club is doing, how we are faring, and to give you a chance to have a say or express your attitude and opinions."

Not much has changed here.

It continues ...

"Naturally, the most important thing to a rugby player is a rugby match..."

Then subs are mentioned...

"Registration... and player's fees are due. It goes like this:

Ordinary club fees - \$2 Players fees - \$5
