35th Anniversary

"THE BATTLE OF NIGHTCLIFF HOTEL" A story from the archives: Croc Tales, August 1989

Early in Palmerston's history the club had a run-in of mammoth proportions with the locals of Nightcliff Hotel (now the Dolphin) which came close to laying low every player. It began on a Friday night in 1976. As was the custom most of the blokes – we only had one team – would meet at a flat on the corner of Trower Road and Limmen Street early on Friday night to plan the night's entertainment. It was never hard to get a quorum as 11 of the 15 players lived in two of the flats (owned by Dave Cooper). This particular Friday night two members were missing: Bruce Torrie and Craig? They were half back and wing – our two smallest and youngest players. They arrived about 7pm bloodied and battered, very similar to Saturday after a game.

The story was a common one. They had been drinking for a while at the Nightcliff Hotel. "Why the Nightcliff?" was the chorus. At about 6pm the bouncers told them they would have to leave or pay a cover charge. Bruce had just brought a beer and said ever so politely as Kiwis always do, that he would be going after that beer. Apparently the bouncers were in a bit more of a hurry than Bruce and Craig as they proceeded to turf them out. Bruce's wallet was still on the counter and so he was not keen to leave. He mentioned this to the bouncer and he also mentioned something about the bouncer's ancestry. Anyway the bouncer got upset and bashed the s—t out of Bruce and Craig. In this he was aided by a few of the locals.

So there we were – sober, ready for a night's entertainment and wondering how we could let the bouncer know he had upset the Crocs. Then we heard the car start outside and with a few expletives like "We'll kill the rotter" and "Damn his soul" Billy O'Neil and Lloyd Wardrop, also Kiwis, shot off into the sunset bent on revenge. We were all in a bit of a panic as though Lloyd was a tough bastard, Billy was more of a comedian and rarely raised his voice except to ask for a beer. Then the car returned, and out got Billy, walking through the door and asking "Where did this happen anyway?"

Well the decision had been made. The pub would pay in full. We all jumped into two cars and headed for the Nightcliff. On reaching the car park we noticed it was full. Perhaps we should make some plans. Unfortunately the Kiwi mob was on a high. Daff Niel marched into the disco and demanded to see the bouncer. Without waiting for a reply the cash register was thrown through the plate glass door (by persons unknown) and it was on. It didn't last long – thank God – but in the fracas the bouncer had been dropped and was looking unwell. A look around showed that amazingly we were all still standing. We began to back out of the bar (just like John Wayne did in his movies) and then we made our biggest and final tactical error. We went back in. Someone jostled one of the blokes and we became involved in a bit more physical stuff. This time the fight was on for young and old, a few hundred of them and 11 of us. Tables, billiard cues, pot plants, can glasses, jugs, chairs, the lot was used.

Soon we noticed that we were no longer needed in the fight. It seemed to be going well without us so we staged a strategic withdrawal – to the hospital. The remainder of the night was spent lining up for stiches, bandaging, x-rays, plaster, etc. The nurses weren't that sympathetic and kept asking "where's the other side?" However the night did have its brighter moments. Billy O'Neil met a girl in casualty and fell in love – for a short while anyway. The next day we were scheduled to play Casuarina in a friendly game of cricket. Due to the number of head bandages in the side we were dubbed the Indian side. Casuarina has always been quick to stick it in.

Most of the gang are back in Kiwi land now and are quite sane and upstanding members of their community – odd for Kiwis. I wonder if they have told their wives and children about their night out at the Nightcliff Hotel.
