Tonight sees several of our Under 16s and Under 18s play against visiting English school side St. Albans. We wish both sides all the best.


The Seniors play their last games for the season on Saturday, followed by the Senior Presentation Night on Saturday night. Places are still available for those that would like to go.

Once again the preparation for the game was disjointed due to players being unavailable but a win would have set us up for a possible elimination final type game in two weeks' time against Dragons and a chance to sneak into the finals.

With an injury list that had grown over the past two playing weeks, and the unsettling effects of bye rounds, we had to pull one or two players out of retirement to put 15 tri coloured jumpers on the ground.

We managed to fill all positions while University were in an equal position with their side starting with 12, then 13, then 15. The two sides were evenly matched which meant that play moved quickly between the 22 metre lines at each end but rarely penetrated beyond. Palmy had overlaps but failed to get the ball out quickly at the right times.

The club 100% raises its own funding through sponsorship, subscriptions, the bar, grants that we apply for, and fund raising activities. The club is also 100% run by volunteers and does not have any paid positions. Last year, it cost over \$100 000 to run the club (from Under 6s through to A Grade). Sponsorships and subs raised just over \$55 000, meaning that we had to raise another \$50 000.

We do this, and do it successfully; however it's the reason your support of events such as the Darwin Show Clean Up is very important and much appreciated by all club members!
