Significant was the fact that Palmy started the game with intensity and concentration from the first whistle. While Dragons were first to score, it took some hard work and they were forced to construct the opportunity which was a change from the cheap early points we had seen on so many occasions previously. Palmerston defence was solid for long periods throughout the game and put pressure on the passes and forced errors. A clinical and smart use of our pace from outside backs saw some classic rugby and the opportunity for our dominant forwards to win ball and turn defence to attack.

The second half started very similar to the first. Palmerston were clearly on the ascendency and provided good ball for what I hope is a glimpse to the future with a young strong, quick backline that made ground and looked exciting every time they ran. It's near impossible to single out any individual players as being the best on ground as this was a truly 18 player effort, but I will make mention of Gavin McHugh who had a blinder and along with Chris Mead and Paul Devir played a full game of B grade prior to the A grade. 'Devo' and 'Meady' both scored tries with a third scored by Paul Williams. Dragons had a bit more penetration to the try line and used possession to full advantage to finish 3 points in front.
