The heat and missed, first time tackles, started to take a toll. Our defence was wanting at times but on the positive we had some very strong runs from several players who made good meters but the last five per cent of players backing up didn't allow our boys to fully capitalize on the good play. By half time despite being a few points down the game was still neither won nor lost.

The second half started well with a stronger more dominant scrum despite being a man down due to a red card infringement. An early error led to another try by swampdogs. It was truly a hard slog in the heat through the second half and the difference between the two teams was fitness and hunger. Swampdogs looked a little more hungry to get to the ball with numbers. Palmy looked good on attack for the most part of the game and used possession well but there was a clear lack of intensity and willingness to move up in defense which gave the opposition time and space to get organised.

Tries to Paul Williams and "Devo" with conversions and strong performance by Dominic Mead, Damian Collie, Ryan Cotton, Brad Hogan and the two try scorers wasn't enough to finish the game in front. A disappointing start to the season but more than enough positives to give confidence that wins will come once we get some consistency at training that can be transferred to the pitch.

By mid first half we had converted two penalties through the boot of Peter 'Devo' Devir. At 14 - 6 down we had some work to do but still looked competitive. Unfortunately Souths were able to make good progress through their big hard running forwards and the couple of speedsters in the backline and their lead increased regularly.

# **Territory** halfback has jaw broken

THE Chiefs paid a heavy price for their 19-7 Super Rugby defeat of the Highlanders on Friday, with halfback Tawera Kerr-Barlow breaking his jaw and set to be sidelined for six weeks.

Territorian Kerr-Barlow, who made his All Blacks debut last year, played the 80 minutes at Waikato Stadium but was later found to have suffered a break on the right side of his jaw.

A Chiefs statement said the 22-year-old would undergo surgery this week.

A six-week recovery period would have him returning to action in early May.

The NT junior representative played his first two All Blacks Tests on last year's tour to Europe, coming off the reserve bench against Scotland and Italy.

Augustine Pulu is set to start at halfback for the Chiefs, although former All Blacks No. 9 Brendon Leonard is poised to re-enter the selection frame.

# Captain's email...

Below is an extract from an email (reproduced with permission) that Michael Killiner, former Palmerston player now living in Singapore, received from his team captain Graham Harkness on the day before their team's grand final game. Replace the words Singapore for the Territory and Wanderers for Palmerston Crocs and the similarities between the two clubs is striking.

"We all love playing rugby. It's the best game in the world and what a rugby club offers you in all aspects of your life is something people who don't play the game will never understand. We all play for that very reason but with that comes responsibility. Responsibility to the club, to your team, to yourself, to whoever got you started playing rugby and to whoever gave you the opportunity to be at where you are now, on the eve of a Grand Final.

Singapore is a transient place. People come and go for all sorts of reasons. Maintaining a rugby club of any sort under these circumstances takes a huge amount of commitment and effort. When you consider only one club has a clubhouse and field to call home, this feat is even more remarkable. We owe a huge amount to those Wanderers who have gone before us. Add our small legacy to the heritage of the club and make sure that future Wanderers keep coming to this club and appreciate what it stands for. This club looks after its own, it's our turn to look after the club."
