Again another close loss.
Following is Ben Blyton's view of the game. 'What a feeling of disappointment - this was one game that we should have definitely won - we again played well in patches but struggled to mount real pressure on University through being consistently penalised at the breakdown.

Due to these penalties we had to defend for long periods. Karl McFarland and Anthony Lees led the way in back line defence with Matt 'Fang' Pheeney, Nathan Pierpoint, Bob Mitchell and Scott Reinke holding it together for the forwards.

Our first score was a long range try by Scott. It appeared he may have regretted scoring it judging by his reaction to the University water.

The 2nd half saw the forwards really begin to show their University opposition how to play. Fang and his lifters began to steel all of University's line out ball, the pick and drive by the forwards was working well and this along with the driving maul saw us making huge metres up the middle which the two centres, Henry Dau (welcome back) and Karl took full advantage of to make many breaks and look dangerous.
