The game started out like a true final, very close with few opportunities to score. Our defence was working well and even though we were running against the wind we were able to maintain

reasonable field position. As the half went on we started to gain some dominance through a supply of ball from **Denny Johnston** at the line out, and also getting our fair share of turnovers at the breakdown.

This pressure led to a couple of scoring opportunities, unfortunately out of about the 4 chances we had we only managed to score one try and that was by **Paul Veach** who scored just before half time.

Half Time score to us 5 nil.

In the second half the wind picked up but also changed direction and we found that again we were running into it. Unfortunately the ball that we were winning in the 1st half dried up as well and we were forced to defend for most of the half, this pressure eventually took its toll and Dragons scored a try which they converted about half way through the second half to take a 7-5 lead. Later they used the wind to good effect to kick a penalty from about half way to make the score 10-5.

The boys tried hard all day but never really looked like scoring again. Our line out suffered a bit in the second half, but our scrum was solid and the ball we did win we were able to maintain for long periods but we never made inroads into their defence. On saying this when the Dragons got the ball, we also had to defend for long periods.

In the last few minutes while we were throwing every thing we had at Dragons a mistake led to them scoring their second try to make the score 17-5.

In the end 2 tries to 1 was not a real indication of the game
