The Palmerston U16's competed in the NT U16 Championships over last Friday night and the weekend. The weekend was earmarked as an initial trial for selection in the **NT Indigenous U16** and **NT U16 teams** for respective National Championships.

Snowden saw the week-end this way. "The 'Colts' lined up against Dragons on Friday night and then Alice Springs and Gove on Saturday morning...culminating in a **3** -**0** win/loss result.

This put us automatically into the final against University on Sunday.

The game against the Dragons was excellent. The Dragons came at us as a more cohesive and determined opposition this time round. They were more effective at contesting the tackle/ruck than previously and this made for a very physical game, as the injury to **Roddy Barua** that kept him out for the remainder of the tournament can attest.

We were dominant though, at the contest we were more aggressive and we operated at a lower body height. This suits our game plan of 'pick and hammer', 'pick and latch', long place ruck ball with a 'skinny gate', up the tram tracks and then to the backs when stretched. Don't laugh!!
