Coach Killiner reports: 'We traveled to Jabiru for a catch up game from Darwin Show weekend and with a man down from the start it was always going to be a tough assignment as Jabiru home games traditionally are. We started the game in the best possible way with **Squirter** and Bronson 'Mitch' Mitchell combining well in mid field for a converted try under the posts less than 5 minutes into the game. Now that's something you don't see every day in a Jabiru home game.

The Bushratz hit back in the best possible way by tightening up their game and really muscling up. They scored shortly after and at 7-7 we had a ball game.

Jabiru's pack out weighed us considerably and with a couple of new faces in their pack they

were able to put pressure on both our scrum and lineouts
