The game started with a patient and controlled structure. We went through many phases and kept possession and drove forward. The first try was an absolute gem by Vili Leqa. From a ruck we went left but Vili knew the opportunity was on the right. He passed back right, a beautiful 20m pass that hit Wise Sekitoga on the chest. Wise went forward and passed inside to Vili!

Where did he come from? **Vili** scored.

This pattern continued until a scrum in about the 21<sup>st</sup> minute. Souths pushed us around and got a bit of a sniff of possibility. The Souths No 10 explored the passage close to our forwards and found space. Souths felt they were onto something with these two strengths and we helped out by giving away seven penalties in the second set of 20 minutes (only two in the first 20 minutes).
