NT Schoolboys

CrocTales has managed to locate a reporter at the Australian Schools Division II Championships in Geelong and Sean 'Boulder' Killiner has provided the following reports on the NT's 3 games to date.

Thanks Boulder. Game 1 v Lloyd McDermott

This was a non competition game and the coaches used the opportunity to start some of the players not considered in the 1st 15. A number of Palmy players got a start with Jai Wyles-Kelly, Blake Bishell and Michael Killiner having strong games. The Lloydy's were very strong in the midfield with their centres creating plenty of chances. The NT's loan try scorer was **Kyle Davies** with a bullocking run from a tap kick about 5 metres out. The final score was Lloydy's 19 d NT 11.

Game 2 v Tasmania

The first of the competition games saw the NT field its strongest team with Blake Bishell, Blake Chadwick, **Tom Cummins, Michael** Killiner, and Kyle Davies all starting. In a very tightly contested 1st half the NT were down 6 to 5 at half time with their only points coming from

a try by Michael Killiner.

The 2nd half was a real arm wrestle and with the NT slotting over a penalty after about 5 minutes, the emphasis was on maintaining their lead. This was made virtually impossible by the number of penalties given away. In what Bernie Bree and I can only describe as the most over officiated game we have ever had the misfortune to see the NT were on the back of an horrendous penalty count and with less that 2 minutes on the clock Tasmania slotted a penalty goal from an impressive 45 metres out.

Final score Tasmania 9 d NT 8 - definitely the one that got away. The faces told the story - the team was gutted.

Game 3 v Victoria

The NT faced a huge challenge against a strong Victorian side and started the game with great commitment and after 5 minutes of sustained pressure were 7-0. The Victorians hit back with a try and at 7-5 the NT boys were competitative and showing some real spirit. The Victorians scored again shortly after to be up 12-7 and there was a chance the game could slip away. The NT held on until half time having to defend phase after phase - it

was a great effort.

Unfortunately, they could not hold out a much stronger and faster Victorian side.

Final score Victoria 36 d NT 7. **Kyle** and **Michael** had strong games with **Tom** having a strong first half until he was replaced due to injury early in the second half. Robbie Cotter started on the wing and played strongly. He was called upon during the 2nd half to take on the kicking duties and showed he was more than capable of the step up. The NT's try was scored by Josh Hall.

The final game was scheduled for this morning and was against South Australia. This was the last chance for players to impress for selection for the Combined States side.


